The Great Tequila Taste Test

I have been taking wine to the reunion since 2009 when I shipped a case of Jarhead Red to Al Gautschi in Hubbard. Since then I have substituted “Hotel Company Wine”. In 2012 I added a bottle of “Cava de Oro extra anejo”, an aged tequila that I had picked up in Mexico at a very hefty price. This



is sipping stock. It is not the stuff you blend in a Margarita. It went over well. Ultimately, I discovered that it was available in San Diego at a small store just down the road from the location of the 2014 reunion. It was also considerably cheaper in San Diego than what I was paying in Mexico. There were many side trips made by Marines to the store to pick up a bottle to take home. (including me)

However, there were some people who said that the San Diego tequila was not as good as the tequila purchased in Mexico. (My wife and daughter) To answer this question and get to the bottom of this great controversy I did a little research. First we scheduled a New Year’s Eve cruise to Mexico. I am always willing to go the extra mile for you guys. While in Cabo San Lucas, I

questioned the guy behind the counter as to why I could buy his product in San Diego cheaper than I could in Mexico. Explanation was that the stuff in Mexico is bottled there, has a slightly lower alcohol level by law and comes with a little sticker. San Diego tequila is shipped in bulk form and bottled in the U.S.

Again going the extra mile for you guys, I bought a bottle of the higher priced sticker encrusted lower alcohol content tequila to perform a taste test. If you include the cost of the cruise to Mexico, this is really one expensive bottle of tequila.

We did a blind taste test to see if it is worth the extra cost. There were plenty of volunteers. Carolin, my daughter Carlie, her boy friend Gabe and I all participated. It was initially determined



that it would take a lot more than just one taste. All of the volunteers felt they could make the sacrifice. And of course we all did.

Bottom line is that there was no clear winner. No one was 100% consistent with their choice. We all agree that the more you drink the better it tastes and given the cost savings and the fact that they deliver to your doorstep we also all agree that Old Town Liquor and Deli is the best buy..

This deal may not last for ever so, if you want some great wine at a good price with the Hotel Company logo, take advantage of it soon.

The red at the reunion was the "Fusion". The white at the San Diego reunion was a "Moscato". (Both \$12.00 per bottle) I order those because I like them.

Windsor has many great selections at various prices. If you did not like the wines at the reunions or if you just want to try something different, go to the Windsor web site (windsorvineyards.com), review the various choices and prices, and then talk to Dave. However, to get the deal you need to call Dave at the above number or by email. The offer is not available on line.
