

Santa Fe Reunion Travel Planning

For those driving to Santa Fe:

Have a safe trip. Interstate 25 between Albuquerque and Santa Fe can during morning and evening rush hour commutes be more time consuming. The City of Santa Fe has seven pay parking lots. Downtown Santa Fe parking is expensive. Limited one-hour and two-hour metered street parking is available at \$2.00/hour. Disabled persons with plates or tags can park for free. Parking at our hotel is free, but you must register your vehicle when you arrive at the hotel.

For those flying to Santa Fe:

You can now fly directly to Santa Fe with daily commercial service from Phoenix and Dallas through American Airlines. It is easier flying from there to Santa Fe than into Albuquerque and then using ground transportation to Santa Fe.

For those flying into Albuquerque:

Once you've landed in Albuquerque, you are still an hour and fifteen minutes driving time to Santa Fe. May we suggest the following options?

1. Make reservations for shuttle service between the Albuquerque Airport and Santa Fe. Shuttle providers: SANDIA SHUTTLE (888-775-5696, sandiaahuttle.com) and ROADRUNNER SHUTTLE & CHARTER (505-424-3367, rideroadrunner.com).
2. The New Mexico Rail Runner Express train runs seven days a week. (866-795-7245).
3. Rent a car and drive to Santa Fe. AVIS and Hertz are available.
4. Contact one of us reunion attendees that are traveling by car from the west to Santa Fe in advance of the reunion to catch a ride from us while we are driving through to Santa Fe.
